



Cruise & Maritime Voyages Makes Inaugural Call at Poole

Maritime traditions were upheld at the Port of Poole as Poole Harbour Commissioners and the cruise ship Astoria exchanged plaques to commemorate the ship's inaugural call to the port.

During her maiden voyage from Poole, the Astoria dropped anchor in Poole Bay for her guests to enjoy the spectacular Bournemouth Air Festival before continuing her onward journey to Honfleur and Rouen.

At 160m (525ft) the Astoria, operated by Cruise & Maritime Voyages is the largest cruise ship to have visited Poole's new cruise berth, South Quay, since it opened in May this year. At 200m long and 40m wide, the new £10m deep water quay is said to be one of the largest port developments seen on the South Coast in recent years and can accommodate vessels up to 220m in length.
