

British Isles named Destination of the Year 2025

Cruise Britain and Cruise Ireland working together as the British Isles have jointly been awarded Destination of the Year at the 2025 Seatrade Cruise Awards. This marks the first time that the British Isles as a combined cruise entity has bid for an internationally recognised travel honour and is testament to the increasing strength of the relationship supporting the British Isles cruising region.



The Destination of the Year award recognises a location or cruising region that consistently delivers exceptional experiences to cruise passengers and cruise lines, standing out for its visitor offering, operational excellence and collaborative approach within the industry.

The award was presented at a ceremony celebrating excellence across the global cruise industry. Accepting the accolade on behalf of both organisations were Kay Greenway, Director of Cruise Britain and Ann Doherty, Chair of Cruise Ireland.

In an industry first, Cruise Britain and Cruise Ireland came together at Seatrade Europe to exhibit under Cruise the British Isles and hosted a joint reception at the event.

The recognition follows the signing of a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Cruise Britain and Cruise Ireland at Seatrade Cruise Global in 2024. The MoU signified a shared commitment to promoting and developing cruise tourism in both Britain and Ireland through cross-border collaboration
