The 9th Dover Cruise Safety and Environment Awareness Award (SEA) has been awarded to Viking Sky, with her sister ship Viking Saturn and Fred. Olsen's Borealis also scoring highly. The SEA Award is designed to help cruise lines evaluate the relative footprint of their operations whilst in port, with a focus on level of recycling compared to category 1 waste, CO₂ emissions per nautical mile and safety procedures.

As a safe, secure and sustainable port with continual targets across the estate and various business areas, the SEA Award is an important part of the Port of Dover's target of carbon net zero.
