

Dover ready to launch cruise season with eight inaugural calls and major cruise lines visiting regularly for turnaround days

Dover Cruise's action-packed 2025 season begins next month, with eight inaugural calls and seven cruise lines choosing the Port as their UK embarkation hub for adventures that bring together some of the world's greatest landscapes.

Whether it's the stunning natural beauty of the Nordic's, the sparkling seas of the Mediterranean and Adriatic coast, or the inspiring culture and heritage of the British Isles and Continental Europe, cruising via Dover this year will connect guests with hundreds of world class destinations.
