A fleet of Zodiac inflatable power boats allow passengers to get close up to beautiful coastal areas, witnessing the natural habitats of a wide variety of sea birds. The liner then heads around the Irish Coast, before heading to the Isle of Man and Scotland. Eleven nights' later passengers arrive in Leith, having visited St Kilda and Aberdeen on their way around the north of the country.
