The first of 14 Saga cruise holidays in 2018 from Portsmouth International Port got underway today – with more than 400 guests sailing south from the Great Waterfront City in search of some winter sun.

The 164 meters long classic ship cruised past the Emirates Spinnaker Tower into Portsmouth Harbour this morning from her last port Lisbon, bringing to an end a 20 night, ‘Traditions of the Canaries and Africa’ cruise. The Port’s cruise team were on hand to welcome the vessel.

They will also cruise to the often overlooked, yet picturesque, Puerto del Rosario which is out of reach to larger vessels’. From there they will be able to explore Fuerteventura’s volcanic landscapes, enjoying winter sun on the island’s impressive beaches.

Guests will be back in Portsmouth in time for Valentine’s Day, when Saga Pearl II starts a new holiday in the opposite direction. The ship will sail to Norway and back on a 16 day cruise. Guests will enjoy spectacular fjords, the bright lights of beautiful towns, a chance to see the dazzling displays of the elusive Aurora Borealis, and a stop 140 miles inside the Arctic Circle.
