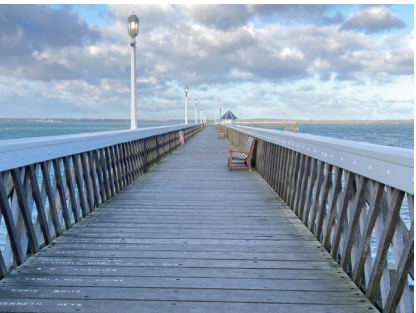


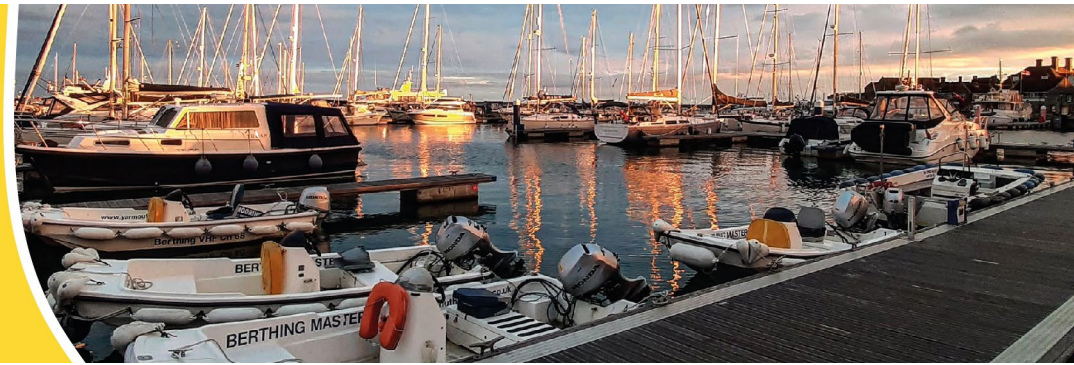
Cruise Yarmouth (Isle of Wight, UK) Harbour Information

Situated on the Isle of Wight's beautiful northwest coast, Yarmouth Harbour is an exciting new small ship cruise destination and a convenient gateway to West Wight's Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.



Welcome to Yarmouth Harbour

Yarmouth's scenic and historic harbour is extremely popular with visiting sailors - yet for most tourists - and cruise passengers - the harbour remains an undiscovered gem of the Solent and UK South Coast.



For cruise lines seeking exciting new ports of call that are inaccessible to the larger cruise ships, Yarmouth Harbour is the ideal small ship destination. With its close proximity to the Solent, The Needles, and the English Channel, Yarmouth Harbour is conveniently situated for ships on UK and Northern European cruise itineraries.

Yarmouth is a tender port where only small ships have the privilege of anchoring, with views of the pretty harbour, the Grade 2 Listed Yarmouth Pier dating from 1876 and a Tudor castle completed in 1547, one of Henry VIII's most sophisticated coastal fortresses.

Just yards from the harbour quayside, Yarmouth offers cruise passengers more history, from the town's quaint cobbled streets to a stunning 17th century church. In fact, Yarmouth has some of the oldest architecture on the Isle of Wight. Nearby, other historical sites include the 17th century Old Town Hall at Newtown National Nature Reserve.

The seaside town of Yarmouth and West Wight provide visitors with an enticing array of eclectic boutique shops and galleries showcasing Island arts and crafts, as well as delectable local cuisine, including at renowned seafront restaurants named in the prestigious Michelin Guide for Great Britain and Ireland.

Yarmouth and West Wight offer a wide array of exciting excursion opportunities with world-renowned landmarks and attractions to discover, off-the-beaten-track experiences at sites of historical, cultural, nautical, and literary interest, a host of activities to try ashore and afloat, a stunning natural and coastal environment to enjoy, and one of Britain's richest fossil localities to explore.

Yarmouth Pier is a Grade 2 Listed structure dating from 1876 with a fascinating history. Stroll along the impressive Pier and enjoy wonderful views of the harbour and West Wight coastline.

Completed in 1547, **Yarmouth Castle** was once one of Henry VIII's most sophisticated coastal fortresses. The castle was well situated to protect the western part of the Isle of Wight and guard the entrance to the Solent.

Farringford is a stunning Grade 1 Listed historic house at Freshwater in West Wight, which was the home of Alfred, Lord Tennyson, the renowned poet of the Victorian era.

Dimbola was the home of the celebrated Victorian photographer Julia Margaret Cameron (1815 – 1879), one of the most important early photographers and now recognised the world over as a pioneer of photography as art.

No visit to the Isle of Wight is complete without a trip to see the world famous **Needles** rocks. The three white chalk stacks leading up to the Needles Lighthouse are one of the Island's most iconic and most photographed sights.

The 20th-century **Mottistone Gardens** use Mediterranean-style planting to take advantage of the warm, southerly location and were created from an abandoned farmyard surrounding a pretty Elizabethan manor house.

A **boat trip** from Yarmouth is a fantastic way to see The Needles, the coloured sands of Alum Bay, and the stunning West Wight coastline.



Yarmouth Pier provides easy access and **fishing** conditions suitable for everyone with a permit from Yarmouth Harbour Office. Sea fishing trips are offered by several local companies operating boat trips on the Solent.

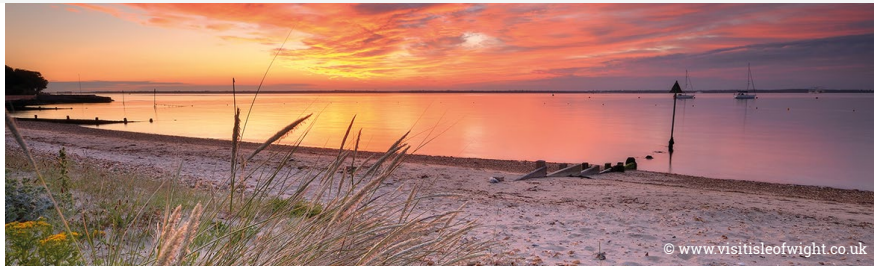


The Isle of Wight is home to over 200 species of **birds** and the Western Yar Estuary at Yarmouth offers excellent bird watching opportunities to view many of the wading birds and waterfowl species that can be found on the Island.



Freshwater Bay Golf Club is one of the most spectacular courses in the UK. Set on downlands overlooking the English Channel, this **seaside golf** course is 5,725 yards long, par 69, providing a challenge for golfers of all abilities.

Yarmouth Harbour's own beach, at **The Sandhard**, is just one of many beautiful beaches to discover in West Wight. Other beaches to explore include Sconce Point, Fort Victoria Woodland Beach, Colwell Bay, Totland Bay, Alum Bay, Scratchell's Bay, Watcombe Bay, Freshwater Bay, Smuggler's Beach, Hanover Point and Compton Bay.

Quiet country lanes and scenic off-road routes make Yarmouth and West Wight the ideal location for **cycling**. With over 200 miles of cycle routes on the Island there are routes to suit everyone, including a choice of challenging off-road bridleways, peaceful byways and level purpose-made tracks on former railway lines.

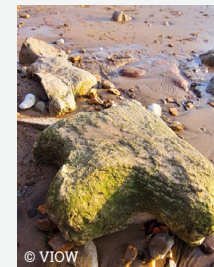
Flowing into Yarmouth Harbour is the **Western Yar Estuary** with its abundant wildlife and gorgeous riverside walks and cycle paths.



Celebrating the Isle of Wight's scientific genius, **Robert Hooke** (1635 to 1703), the circular Robert Hooke Trail includes locations associated with his life and explains their influence on his scientific career.



Take a gentle stroll through the Isle of Wight's only National Nature Reserve at **Newtown Creek**. Home to a wide variety of birds year-round it's a haven for walkers and bird watchers.



Whether you chose east, west or south from Yarmouth, visitors can soon explore one of Britain's richest **fossil localities**, where dinosaurs walked 125 million years ago.

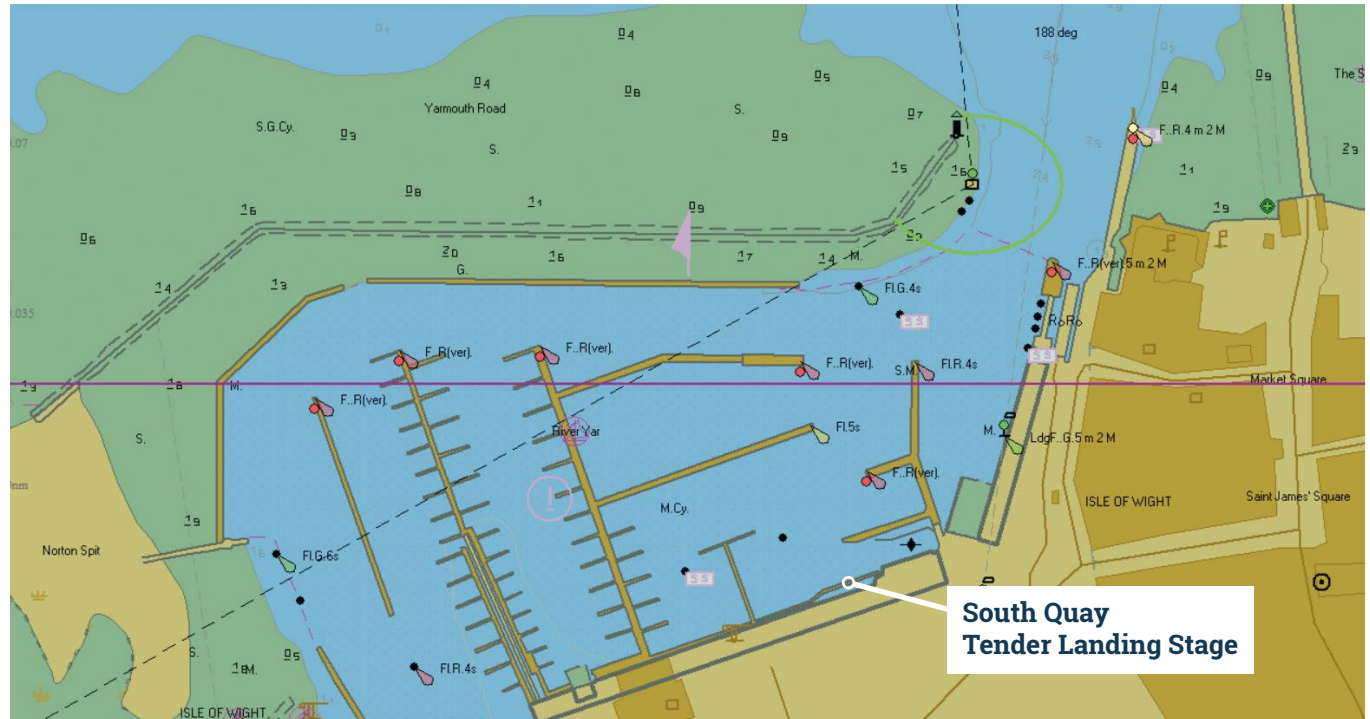

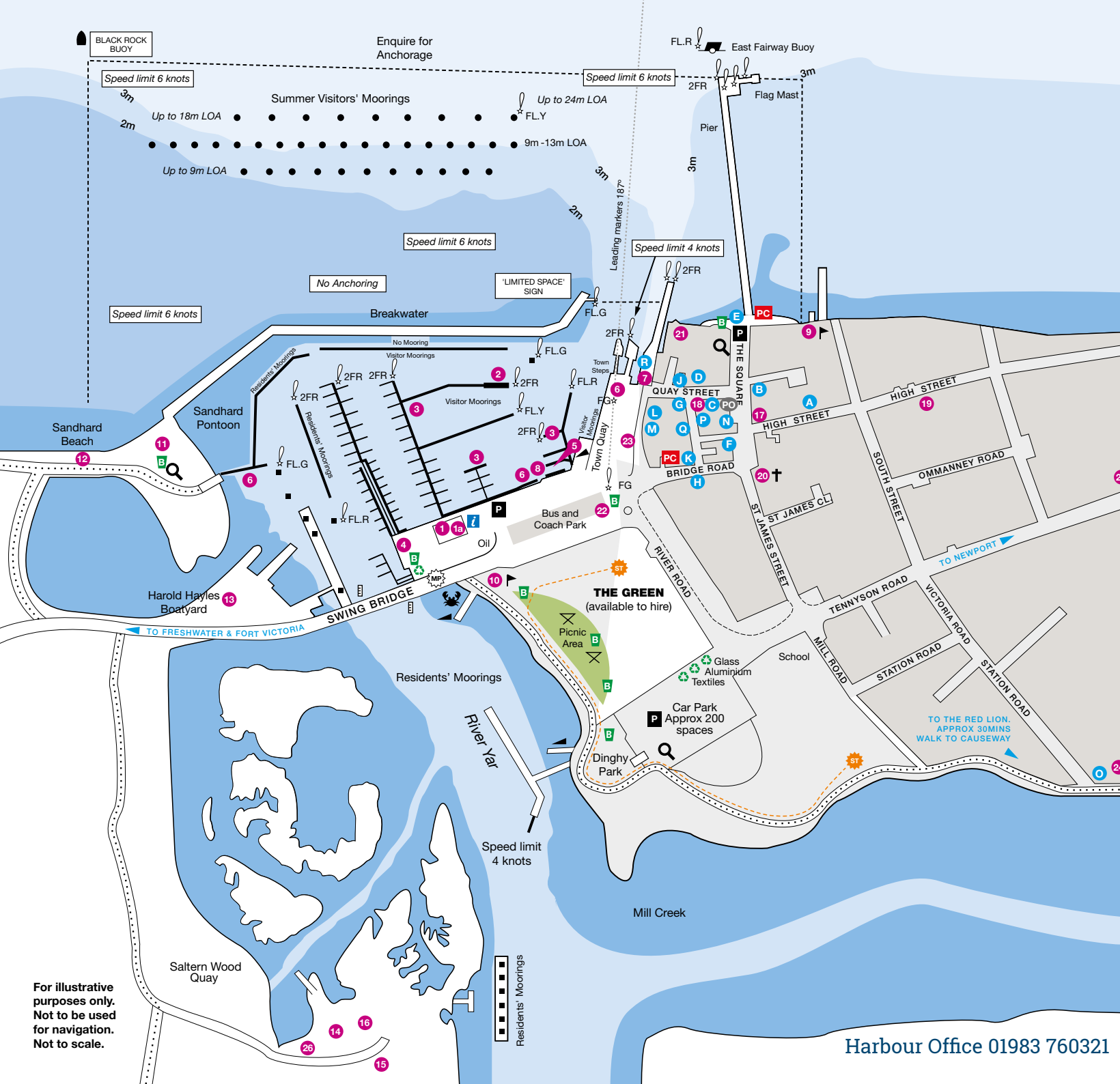
Tenders disembark cruise passengers at South Quay pontoons within Yarmouth Harbour. The landing stage will have a security marquee and Harbour staff will be present to welcome and direct passengers to the Coach Park located next to the tender landing stage.

Shore security: Yarmouth is ISPS compliant and provides locally sourced licensed security staff for the ship to shore connection.

Customs and Immigration:

Customs and immigration is usually arranged via the cruise line's port agent. If this is the vessel's first port-of-call in the UK, port agents will arrange for Customs and Immigration to attend the vessel on arrival for clearance.
